



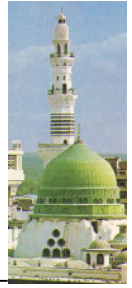

Dear Sir or Madam:

In 1997 we contacted you, through one of our members, about the enzymes, whey and animal-related ingredients in your products.

Your reply (copy enclosed) assured us that enzymes used in the cheese-making process in your products were of microbial origin. (copy enclosed)

Two days ago we received information that **“all Frito Lay cheese seasoning containing products such as all Doritos and Cheetos are made with PORK rennet enzyme.”**

I have just finished talking to Ms. Monique of Frito Lay (@1-800-352-4477) who confirmed that indeed cheese in your products is from animal sources including pork, except in Kosher items.

Based on your earlier letter of 1997, we have been advising our Muslim community that they can consume Doritos and Cheetos.

This is very unsettling that we have misled Muslims based on information provided by your company. We would have appreciated that when you changed your suppliers and began using animal sources for the enzymes that you would make it known to us.

The growing Muslim population in this country deserves that a big company like Frito-Lay, a division of PepsiCo, be sensitive to their dietary needs. In this case I believed that we have not seen that sensitivity. Any positive efforts you can make to address this situation would be welcome.
